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Assessment and Management of Common Clinical Disorders

This program is tailored to equip the practicing chiropractor with practical information to use in an everyday chiropractic office. This course was designed to educate the doctor on anatomical considerations in pain production, diagnosis, orthopedic and neurological testing, biomechanical assessment, and protocols for advanced imaging utilization.

The course also will teach treatment for conditions with manipulation and active care. An interactive case study session of real patients will combine examination, MRI, x-ray, CT findings. This case study session will teach the doctor to use the knowledge learned in class to come up with a proper plan of care.

By the end of this course the chiropractor will have a better understanding of how to assess and manage common clinical disorders and an advanced knowledge of x-ray, MRI and CT.

A specific focus on the following conditions will be emphasized:

- Cervical and lumbar disc herniation and discogenic vs. facetogenic pain
- Lumbar pre-spondylolysis, spondylolysis and spondylolisthesis
- Other commonly encountered entities in the congenital, arthritis, traumatic and neoplastic categories of bone and joint disease.
